SB 9 Relating to mobile communication devices

SB 9 changes the offense of operating a motor vehicle while using a mobile communications device from a Class D traffic violation to a Class C traffic violation.

Class D traffic violations are subject to a maximum fine of \$250 while a Class C traffic violation is subject to a maximum fine of \$500.

The measure directs the Department of Transportation to place signs on state highways notifying drivers of the violation and maximum fine. The measure includes a one-time Other Funds expenditure limitation of \$130,350 to the Department of Transportation for costs related to updating the DMV records and the Oregon Driver's manual and design, material and installation of approximately 100 signs at Oregon borders and other state highway locations throughout the state.

The Capital Construction Subcommittee recommends SB 9 be amended and reported out do pass as amended.

Summary of Revenue Changes

The Oregon Department of Transportation does not receive revenue from fines for violations of the rules of the road. The revenue from the fines is primarily distributed to the courts. The revenue for the department's responsibilities under this bill will be derived through the Highway Trust Fund.

Summary of Capital Construction Subcommittee Action

Senate Bill 9-B increases the level of the violation for the offense of operating a motor vehicle while using a mobile communications device to a Class C violation with a maximum fine of \$500. Senate Bill 9 also requires the Oregon Department of Transportation to post signs along state highways, notifying the public of the maximum fine.

The Subcommittee recommended an additional Other Funds expenditure limitation of \$130,350 for the department to comply with its responsibilities under this bill.

- On page 1 of the printed A-engrossed bill, line 2, delete "and" and before
- 2 the period insert "; and limiting expenditures".

- On page 2, delete lines 1 through 20 and insert:
- **"SECTION 1.** ORS 811.507 is amended to read:
- 6 "811.507. (1) As used in this section:
- 7 "(a) 'Hands-free accessory' means an attachment or built-in feature for or
- 8 an addition to a mobile communication device, whether or not permanently
- 9 installed in a motor vehicle, that when used allows a person to maintain
- both hands on the steering wheel.
- "(b) 'Mobile communication device' means a text messaging device or a
- 12 wireless, two-way communication device designed to receive and transmit
- 13 voice or text communication.

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- "(2) A person commits the offense of operating a motor vehicle while us-
- ing a mobile communication device if the person, while operating a motor
- vehicle on a highway, uses a mobile communication device.
- "(3) This section does not apply to a person who activates or deactivates
- 18 a mobile communication device or a function of the device or who uses the
- 19 device for voice communication if the person:
- 20 "(a) Is summoning medical or other emergency help if no other person in

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- 2 "(c) Is operating an ambulance or emergency vehicle;
- 3 "(d) Is 18 years of age or older and is using a hands-free accessory;
- "(e) Is operating a motor vehicle while providing public safety services or emergency services;
- "(f) Is operating a motor vehicle while acting in the scope of the person's employment as a public safety officer, as defined in ORS 348.270;
- 8 "(g) Is operating a tow vehicle or roadside assistance vehicle while acting 9 in the scope of the person's employment;
- "(h) Holds a valid amateur radio operator license issued or any other license issued by the Federal Communications Commission and is operating an amateur radio;
 - "(i) Is operating a two-way radio device that transmits radio communication transmitted by a station operating on an authorized frequency within the citizens' or family radio service bands in accordance with rules of the Federal Communications Commission;
- "(j) Is operating a vehicle owned or contracted by a utility for the purpose of installing, repairing, maintaining, operating or upgrading utility service, including but not limited to natural gas, electricity, water or telecommunications, while acting in the scope of the person's employment; or
- "(k) Is using a function of the mobile communication device that allows for only one-way voice communication while the person is:
 - "(A) Operating a motor vehicle in the scope of the person's employment;
- 24 "(B) Providing transit services; or
- 25 "(C) Participating in public safety or emergency service activities.
- "(4) The offense described in this section, operating a motor vehicle while using a mobile communication device, is a Class [D] C traffic violation.
- "(5) The Department of Transportation shall place signs on state highways to notify drivers that violation of this section is subject to a maximum fine of \$500.

"SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of \$130,350 is established for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Department of Transportation for administrative and operating expenses incurred in carrying out the provisions of this 2013 Act."
