To this day, when I smell tobacco smoke on an individual, I try not to breathe because when I do I can feel the toxins from the tobacco being inhaled into my lungs. My dad has tried to quit the tobacco smoking habit several times and for a while he was successful. He is now 82 years old and back to smoking tobacco.

Please pass Senate Bill 444.
