SUMMARY

Decreases allowable speed in residence district from twenty-five miles per hour to twenty miles per hour.

- 2 Relating to vehicle speed; creating new provisions; and amending ORS
- 3 811.105 and 811.111.
- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 811.105 is amended to read:
- 6 811.105. (1) Any speed in excess of a designated speed posted by authority
- 7 granted under ORS 810.180 is prima facie evidence of violation of the basic
- 8 speed rule under ORS 811.100.
- 9 (2) If no designated speed is posted by authority granted under ORS
- 10 810.180, any speed in excess of one of the following speeds is prima facie
- 11 evidence of violation of the basic speed rule:
- 12 (a) Fifteen miles per hour when driving on an alley or a narrow residen-13 tial roadway.
- 14 (b) Twenty miles per hour in a business district.
- 15 (c) Twenty miles per hour on a highway in a residence district if:
- 16 (A) The residence district is not located within a city; and
- 17 (B) The highway is neither an arterial nor a collector highway.
- [(c)] (d) Twenty-five miles per hour in any public park.
- 19 [(d) Twenty-five miles per hour on a highway in a residence district if:]
- 20 [(A) The residence district is not located within a city; and]
- 21 [(B) The highway is neither an arterial nor a collector highway.]

- 1 (e) Fifty-five miles per hour in locations not otherwise described in this 2 section.
- 3 **SECTION 2.** ORS 811.111 is amended to read:
- 811.111. (1) A person commits the offense of violating a speed limit if the person:
- 6 (a) Drives a vehicle on an interstate highway at a speed greater than 65 miles per hour or, if a different speed is posted under ORS 810.180 (3), at a speed greater than the posted speed.
- 9 (b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of this subsection, drives any of the following vehicles at a speed greater than 55 miles per hour on any highway or, if a different speed is posted under ORS 810.180 (3), at a speed greater than the posted speed:
- 13 (A) A motor truck with a gross vehicle weight rating of more than 10,000 pounds or a truck tractor with a gross vehicle weight rating of more than 8,000 pounds.
- 16 (B) A school bus.
- 17 (C) A school activity vehicle.
- 18 (D) A worker transport bus.
- 19 (E) A bus operated for transporting children to and from church or an 20 activity or function authorized by a church.
- 21 (F) Any vehicle used in the transportation of persons for hire by a 22 nonprofit entity as provided in ORS 825.017 (9).
- 23 (c) Drives a vehicle or conveyance on any part of the ocean shore in this 24 state at a speed greater than any of the following:
- (A) Any designated speed for ocean shores that is established and posted under ORS 810.180.
- 27 (B) If no designated speed is posted under ORS 810.180, 25 miles per hour.
- 28 (d) Drives a vehicle upon a highway in any city at a speed greater than
- 29 a speed posted by authority granted under ORS 810.180 or, if no speed is
- 30 posted, the following:
- 31 (A) Fifteen miles per hour when driving on an alley or a narrow resi-

- 2 (B) Twenty miles per hour in a business district.
- 3 (C) Twenty miles per hour on a highway in a residence district if 4 the highway is not an arterial highway.
- 5 [(C)] (**D**) Twenty-five miles per hour in a public park.
- [(D) Twenty-five miles per hour on a highway in a residence district if the highway is not an arterial highway.]
- 8 (E) Sixty-five miles per hour on an interstate highway.
- 9 (F) Fifty-five miles per hour in locations not otherwise described in this 10 paragraph.
- 11 (e) Drives a vehicle in a school zone at a speed greater than 20 miles per 12 hour if the school zone is:
- (A) A segment of highway described in ORS 801.462 (1)(a) and:
- (i) The school zone has a flashing light used as a traffic control device and operated under ORS 810.243 and the flashing light indicates that children may be arriving at or leaving school; or
- (ii) If the school zone does not have a flashing light used as a traffic control device, the person drives in the school zone between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. on a day when school is in session.
- 20 (B) A crosswalk described in ORS 801.462 (1)(b) and:
- 21 (i) A flashing light used as a traffic control device and operated under 22 ORS 810.243 indicates that children may be arriving at or leaving school; or
- 23 (ii) Children are present, as described in ORS 811.124.
- 24 (2) The offense described in this section, violating a speed limit, is 25 punishable as provided in ORS 811.109.
- SECTION 3. The amendments to ORS 811.105 and 811.111 by sections
 1 and 2 of this 2013 Act apply to offenses committed on or after the
 effective date of this 2013 Act.
