 Mission: To ensure food safety and provide consumer protection; to protect agricultural natural resources; and to promote economic development in the agricultural industry.

• Examples:

- ▼ Safety and consumer protection: retail store and producer inspections, gas station pump accuracy, regulate animal feed, laboratory testing of milk and shellfish
- ▼ Environmental protection: non-native pests and plants monitoring, water quality management plan, pesticide and fertilizer use education and labeling
- **▼** *Economic development*: marketing, commodity commissions



Agriculture Expenditure History/2013-15 Governor's Budget






Agriculture Revenue Sources









• Investments:

- 2011-13 biennium budget-related adjustments.
 - ➤ Shift funding back to General Fund from one-time use of federal Pacific Coastal Salmon Recovery Funds.
 - **May 2012 Emergency Board action.**
 - Abolishes one management position in Marketing.
 - **▼** Sept 2012 Emergency Board action.
 - Aligns budget authority with demand for services and provides three positions for an FDA cooperative agreement.





• Investments continued:

- Revenue shortfalls
 - **▼** Measure 76 Lottery Funds insufficient to cover existing program.
 - Reduce Lottery Funds for weed control, integrated pest prevention and management, and plant conservation programs.
 - Threatened & Endangered Plants: restores plant conservation reductions using Other Funds and Federal Funds.
 - Weed Control & Integrated Pest Prevention & Management Fund Shift: Restores some of the program reduction from above.
 - **▼** Non-Measure 76 Lottery Funds insufficiency.
 - Reduce county fairs payment.





• Investments continued:

- Continue programs
 - **Wolf predation compensation.**
 - **▼** Pesticide outreach and compliance monitoring.
 - Maintains program , including Baker City field office.

Initiatives

- **▼** Pesticide stewardship partnership.
 - Joint effort with the Department of Environmental Quality.
- **▼** Integrated Water Resource Strategy.
 - Policy and technical assistance to farmers and ranchers.





- Investments continued:
 - Miscellaneous adjustments
 - Commodity Commission Oversight.
 - Position for required administration of commissions.
 - **▼** Specialty Crop Program.
 - Two positions to administer federal block grant.
 - **Equalizes** expenditures for predator control with the Department of Fish and Wildlife.





- Reductions & fund shifts
 - Shift administration costs to Other Funds from General Fund.
- Statewide Adjustments
 - Updates to DAS Price List and State Government Services Charges, placeholder for Statewide Administrative Savings, PERS Rate and PERS Policy adjustments
