TriMet strongly supports House Bill 2310, the so-called ConnectOregon program.

ConnectOregon investments address critical state-wide transit capital needs, and the Portland metropolitan area has benefitted from infrastructure improvements that allow transit mobility for commuters, as well as those needing to reach medical and other important social services. These capital improvements are an important part of keeping the metropolitan economy moving.

Past ConnectOregon funding has supported projects like the **188<sup>th</sup> Avenue MAX station reconstruction**, which substantially improved traffic and pedestrian safety and provided an economic spark for revitalization of Gresham's Rockwood neighborhood. ConnectOregon IV is funding TriMet partner **Ride Connection's Resource and Operations Center**, which will provide low-cost mobility for job training, work access, and medical needs for many disabled and elderly residents in our region.
