





• The Bureau of Labor & Industries protects employment rights, advances employment opportunities and protects access, free from discrimination, to housing and public accommodations through programs in:

- Resources to pay Other Funded positions bilingual salary differentials for employees in the Technical Assistance to Employers Program, Civil Rights and Wage & Hour Division

Investments

- Reclassification of two Civil Rights Intake Officers into Civil Rights Field Representatives to assist with investigations and help the Bureau meet its contract obligations with the federal government for 2013-15
- Resources to provide funding for lead worker salary differential for the Civil Rights Division's head housing investigator
- Farm Labor Contractor Fee increase to fully fund the Farm Labor Contractor licensing program tor Fees

- General Fund \$11.84 Million

 - Wage Security Funds (diversion of dollars from unemployment insurance tax paid by employers)
