SUMMARY

Establishes Task Force on Local Control of Education. Sunsets task force on date of convening of 2015 legislative session. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to local control of education; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

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4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Task Force on Local Control of Education is 5 established.

6 (2) The task force consists of six members appointed as follows:

7 (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint three members from
8 among members of the Senate.

9 (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint three
 10 members from among members of the House of Representatives.

(3) The task force shall conduct hearings and request any reports
necessary to determine the impact of chapter 519, Oregon Laws 2011
(Enrolled Senate Bill 909), and chapter 36, Oregon Laws 2012 (Enrolled
Senate Bill 1581), on the ability of school district boards to determine
what is taught in the schools of this state and how the school district
boards measure achievement.

(4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quo rum for the transaction of business.

(5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a ma jority of the members of the task force.

1 (6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chair-2 person.

3 (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority
4 shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.

5 (8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the 6 call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task 7 force.

8 (9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of
9 the task force.

10 (10) The task force may presession file legislation in the manner 11 provided in ORS 171.130 for interim committees. All legislation re-12 commended by official action of the task force must indicate that it 13 is introduced at the request of the task force.

(11) The task force shall report to the Legislative Assembly in the
 manner provided in ORS 192.245 at any time within 30 days after its
 final meeting or at such later time as the President and Speaker may
 designate.

(12) The Legislative Administrator may employ persons necessary
for the performance of the functions of the task force. The Legislative
Administrator shall fix the duties and amounts of compensation of
these employees. The task force shall use the services of continuing
legislative staff, without employing additional persons, to the greatest
extent practicable.

(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are
directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and,
to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish
such information and advice as the members of the task force consider
necessary to perform their duties.

29 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of the 30 convening of the 2015 regular session of the Legislative Assembly as 31 specified in ORS 171.010.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect on its passage.

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
