## Re.: Senate Bill 536

Dear Senator Dingfelder and Committee Members,

The undersigned is the founder and CEO of EV4 Oregon LLC that engages in the design, manufacturing and operation of its unique, made in Oregon, solar ETM<sup>TM</sup> charging station.

The EV4 charging station is operating with a battery system for storage and dispensing of electricity for charging electric vehicles (EV's), allowing a commonly used single phase 120/240 VAC connection to the grid. The solar ETM<sup>TM</sup> charging station does not use the costly 3-phase 480 VAC grid connection, therefore no demand charges on the electrical grid.

This innovative design allows the expansion of EV charging infrastructure beyond the metropolitan area, connecting the more distant cities and rural communities in Oregon.

Senate Bill 536 is a great step forward to support this further expansion of the EV infrastructure. SB 536 will allow and promote State agencies to partner with companies like EV4 to mutual benefit, in particular the State of Oregon.
