**BACKGROUND:** Bedbugs are parasitic insects that feed on blood. They are transported easily in clothing, luggage and on pets, and multiply quickly. Bites from bedbugs are itchy and irritating and can become infected. Bedbug infestations in New York City reached epidemic levels in 2007 and have continued to spread throughout the country. Proponents assert the bill will encourage reporting of bedbug infestations by allowing pest control operators and others to submit data to public health officials without concern the information may become public. This data can be used by public health officials to more effectively address the human and business impact of bedbugs.
