

(3) For each election, at the time the county clerk certifies the results of an election, the clerk shall submit to the Secretary of State a record of:

(a) The number of ballots printed.

(b) The number of ballots mailed to voters.

Ballots are printed, in Multnomah County at least, by a private vendor. The number of ballots printed is not the same as the number of ballots received a new (b) requiring a record of ballots received is needed.

[(3)] (2) A security plan developed and filed under **subsection (1) of** this section is confidential

and not subject to disclosure under ORS 192.410 to 192.505. [Page1lines 24 & 25]

Keeping a security plan confidential during the election, clearly, increases security. Keeping a security plan confidential after an election increases mistrust, and deprives the Secretary of State and the County Clerks of public input. There should be a time limit on a security plan's protection from disclosure under ORS 192.410 to 192.505.
