 - Utility Program, which provides technical and analytical support for regulating:
 - × utility pricing,

 - **utility transactions,**
 - market competition,
 - and the Oregon Universal Service Fund;
 - Residential Service Protection Program funds:
 - phone service for low-income Oregonians,
 - telecommunication assistance for Oregonians with impairments,
 - and continuity of access for Oregonians with medical hardships.

- The agency accomplishes its goals through its:
 - The Policy and Administration Program, which provides:
 - central services to the agency;
 - houses the Administrative Hearings Division of the agency;



Expenditure History/2013-15 Governor's Budget










Total Funds Distribution Across Outcome Areas





Distribution of Agency Budget Across Outcome Area






Agency Budget by Expenditure Category in millions

Public Utility Commission Revenue Sources





- No General Fund or Lottery Funds
- Dedicated Fees (Other Funds)
 - Utility Fee assessed annually on regulated electric, natural gas, water utilities and telecommunications providers
 - A surcharge of \$0.12 on telecommunication provider subscribers dedicated to Residential Service Protection Fund programs
 - An assessment of 8.5% on intrastate retail revenue on certified telecommunication carriers
 - A small portion of the Public Purpose Charge (3% surcharge on PGE and PacifiCorp customer bills)
- Federal grant funds
 - US Department of Transportation (for Natural Gas pipeline safety)
 - American Reinvestment and Recovery Act of 2009 grants
