HB 2211 - Background

- ORS 291.038 defines two (2) information resource management advisory bodies, each with specific membership requirements.
 - Information Resource Management Council (IRMC)
 - Purpose: work with DAS to provide policy direction for and coordination of information technology for state government.
 - Stakeholders Advisory Committee
 - Purpose: work with DAS to establish statewide integrated videoconferencing and statewide online access user fees, services, delivery, rates and long range plans.





HB 2211 - Background

- IRMC and Stakeholders Advisory Committee last met in 2000
- Chief Operating Officer/DAS Director relies on other advisory bodies to fulfill statutory obligations
 - Enterprise Leadership Team
 - Comprised of agency directors or policy level delegates from a group of twenty five state agencies
 - Forms an enterprise level model of leadership, management and oversight of statewide operations
 - Customer Advisory Boards
 - Comprised of representatives from small, medium and large agencies
 - Govern service levels of DAS services and set rates to support those services.





HB 2211 – Proposed Solution

- Remove statutory requirement for these two specific bodies that haven't met in over a decade.
- Delete reference to these two bodies in statute
 - Gives COO/DAS flexibility to craft and implement effective enterprise-level leadership governance in all areas including information resource management
 - Supports customer driven governance, management and oversight model that achieves policy objectives originally outlined within statute.
