SUBJECT: House Bill 2436 – Energy Efficiency and Sustainability Technology

Background

The Energy Efficiency and Sustainable Technology Program (EEAST) provides authority to finance residential and commercial energy efficiency and renewable energy projects by allowing consumers to repay energy loans as a line item charge on their monthly utility bill. The Oregon Department of Energy's Small-scale Energy Loan Program (SELP) received lottery bond proceeds to carry out the EEAST pilot program in May 2010.

Under the EEAST program the Oregon Department of Energy (ODOE) has provided \$2.8 million in grants to various Oregon organizations for the purpose of piloting EEAST programs to assist residential home owners in obtaining low-cost, affordable financing for energy efficiency projects.

To date the EEAST pilots have had an estimated \$25M economic impact within 14 Oregon counties.
