In Support of HB 2671

Chair Tomei and members of the committee:

The Campaign for Oregon's Seniors and People with Disabilities supports the passage and adoption of HB 2671.

For some high-risk, low-income persons, there is no one to serve as a guardian and no money to hire a professional fiduciary. Family members or friends are not available, either because they do not exist, or are not appropriate to be guardian or conservator. These vulnerable people are falling through Oregon's safety net. They fall victim to the self-interest of others and may be unnecessarily placed in institutions. Many of these friendless, exploited and abused individuals are completely on their own.

HB 2671 creates the State Office of the Public Guardian and Conservator to provide public guardian and conservator services. The services may include information, assistance, legal representation and services as a court-appointed fiduciary in guardianship or conservatorship proceedings. The bill requires the State Office to certify and train public guardians and conservators as well as develop a volunteer program to assist the office.

Many states have developed state-wide "public guardian" as a resource to assist and protect these at-risk individuals who are unable to care for themselves. For this reason, the Campaign urges your support of HB 2671.
