

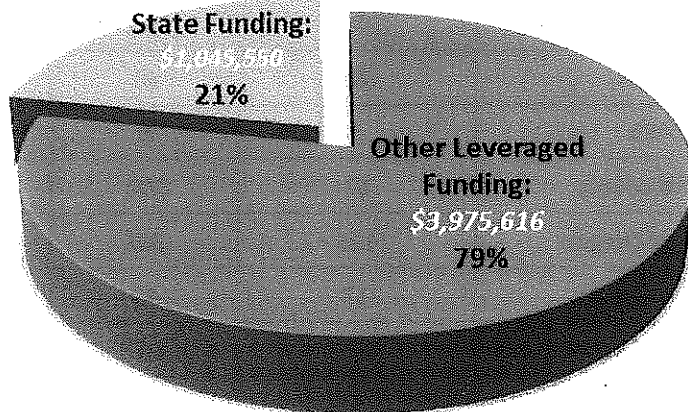

CASA Funding Overview 2012

Currently the state funds 21% of the CASA budget.



For every \$1 Oregon CASA Programs receive from the State of Oregon, they leverage an additional \$3.80 from other funding sources.

A child with a CASA spends an average of **7.5 fewer months** in foster care than a child without a CASA.

The average cost to provide CASA services in Oregon is \$966 per child per year.

In 2011, CASA saved the state over \$21 million in reduced foster care costs alone by getting 1,424 children out of the system 7.5 months earlier.

Oregon CASA Budget Request

- 2 years of funding.
- Restore \$180,000 in statewide program administrative dollars inadvertently omitted from Governor's budget.
- Increase CASA funding an additional \$2.8 million.

An increased investment in CASA Programs ensures children get out of the foster care system as quickly & safely as possible.

Save more taxpayer money now.
