This decline in educational achievement means that, in an increasingly global economy, Oregonians will be less prepared to compete for quality family-wage jobs, both internationally and at home.

It is imperative to Oregon's economy that we ensure that all Oregon high schools students have the ability and the opportunity to go to college.
