Dear Representatives:

Main Street Alliance of Oregon urges you to support and vote favorably on House Bill 2977 B-Engrossed.

Main Street Alliance of Oregon is a network of small businesses statewide, with 1200 businesses on our current roster.

As small business owners, we oppose wage theft. It creates an uneven playing field for employers who pay living wages and provide benefits. We must compete against those who do not.

HB 2977 B-Engrossed addresses a present and increasing problem of unlicensed and unbonded construction labor brokers. These are brokers that provide temporary workers only to construction contractors. They do not include traditional sub-contractors, property owners, and a host of others.

Too many of these construction labor brokers exploit their workers. Workers across the state have testified in recent town halls and before legislators at hearings in the capitol that they are paid in cash, do not receive pay stubs, do not receive minimum wage or overtime, and sometimes are not paid at all. Besides hardship on the laborers, these practices also result in lost spending and lost tax revenue to support our public structures.

Main Street Alliance of Oregon also opposes wage theft because it harms our communities. Wage theft denies income and commerce to our communities. It lowers consumption and spending that directly affects business. And it also corrodes the well-being of the cities and town where we reside. Wage theft means a race to the bottom for workers, businesses, and our communities.

Thank you for your consideration of HB 2977 B-Engrossed. We urge you to pass this bill.
