Measure Description:

Adds post-traumatic stress disorder to definition of "debilitating medical condition" for purposes of statutes authorizing medical use of marijuana.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Judicial Department, Oregon Health Authority (OHA), Department of Justice

Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis:

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the Senate Committee on Health Care and Human Services back to the Senate President for re-assignment to another committee. The bill adds post-traumatic stress disorder to the definition of "debilitating medical condition" for the purpose of statutes authorizing medical use of marijuana. Passage of this bill is anticipated to have a fiscal impact on the Judicial Department, the Department of Justice and the Oregon Health Authority. The amount of this impact is still being determined. A more complete fiscal analysis on the bill will be prepared as the measure is considered in the newly assign committee.
