**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Removes requirement that a jury must distrust a witness who testifies falsely in one part of his or her testimony.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

• Provisions of the measure.

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** Current Oregon Uniform Criminal Jury Instructions state that witnesses <u>must</u> be distrusted if a jury finds they have been false in one part of their testimony. The Oregon Supreme Court decision in *Ireland v. Mitchell*, 226 Or 286, 290, 359 P2d 894 (1961) held that jurors <u>may</u> distrust such a witness, but are not obligated to do so. Senate Bill 55 conforms the statute to the Supreme Court ruling and current practice.
