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**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Eliminates sunset on provision that allows offender on post-prison supervision to be placed on inactive status. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Rewards good behavior
- Fiscal impact if law if inactive supervision status is eliminated

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** Currently, Oregon has over 3,000 offenders under local control post-prison supervision. Offenders may be placed on inactive status when they comply with the terms and conditions of their supervision and require less intensive supervision. The offender's probation or parole officer may return an offender to active supervision if the officer finds it necessary to do so. Inactive supervision was included in House Bill 3508 from the 2010 session. This provision sunsets on July 1, 2013. Offenders are placed under local control after release from serving a sentence of 12 months or less in the local jail. House Bill 3508 allowed for offenders to be placed on inactive supervision status after serving half of his or her sentence.
