WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Creates task force to study the feasibility of establishing Department of Public Safety and Standards and Training facility at Mt. Hood Community College. Lists task force membership and states members serve as volunteers. Requires report to legislature by October 1, 2013. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Former training facilities at Camp Withycomb
- Needs of East Multnomah County

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Clarifies task force members who are legislators are not entitled to per diem or mileage expenses and serve as volunteers. Clarifies other members are not entitled to reimbursement or compensation.

BACKGROUND: This bill establishes a task force to study the possibility of establishing an Oregon Department of Public Safety Standards and Training (DPSST) facility to serve the East Multnomah law enforcement offices. DPSST trains police, fire, corrections, parole and probation, and telecommunications personnel, in addition to licensing private security providers and private investigators in Oregon. Currently, the only facility is outside of Salem and regional training is provided by traveling training officers.
