**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Allows licensees of Oregon Liquor Control Commission to sell wine, cider and malt beverages in certain containers supplied by consumers. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Length of time wine stays fresh in growlers and kegs
- Potential for driving while drinking unchanged by growlers
- Potential for growth of Oregon wine industry
- Success of beer growlers

## **EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** Oregon law currently allows the holder of some types of OLCC liquor licenses to sell malt beverages in clean, re-usable, securely covered containers provided by the consumer for off-site consumption, commonly known as a "beer growler." House Bill 2443-A expands this to allow wine and cider to be sold in "growlers" with a maximum capacity of two gallons per container.
