WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Creates crime of hindering in the second degree. Makes concealing, harboring, aiding, or warning a person who is wanted on a warrant for a class A misdemeanor punishable by a class C misdemeanor. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

MEASURE: SB 340 A

CARRIER: Sen. Johnson

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Incentive to cooperate similar to felonies
- Whether doing nothing could be hindering
- *State v. Turley* (2005)

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Limits to those who are hindering the prosecution of someone who has committed a crime punishable as a class A misdemeanor. Makes hindering prosecution in the second degree a class C misdemeanor.

BACKGROUND: Currently the crime of hindering in the first degree exists, making it a crime to aid, harbor, conceal or warn a person who was wanted for the commission of a felony. Senate Bill 340 A would create the same crime in the second degree for the same conduct but applicable to a person wanted for the commission of a misdemeanor.
