## EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** Currently, federal spending on veterans' health care is discretionary. Veterans are able to receive health care services through the United States Department of Veterans Affairs' health care system only to the extent congressional appropriations allow. House Joint Memorial 9 urges Congress to make the funding of veterans' health care a permanent and direct entitlement.
