**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Relating to electronic proof of insurance. Permits person to electronically verify proof of motor vehicle insurance. Declares emergency, effective upon passage.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Keeping pace with new technology
- Utilizing state data-base or existing state resource
- Five other states utilize this type of service and 20 other states are considering similar legislation this session
- Convenience to the insured
- Law enforcement's support

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** Creates new provisions. Expands verification systems through which law enforcement can confirm proof of insurance to include Law Enforcement Data System.

**BACKGROUND:** House Bill 2107 A permits the insurer to provide proof of insurance by issuing a card or, if the insured agrees, through electronic means. The measure requires insured drivers to carry proof of insurance in each motor vehicle that is operating in Oregon and does not exempt from compliance with financial or future responsibility requirements. The use of an electronic device to display proof of insurance does not constitute consent for a police officer to access other contents of the electronic device.
