WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Removes the January 2, 2014 sunset on the Practitioner-Managed Prescription Drug Plan (PMPDP).

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Integration of behavioral health in community care organizations and comprehensive drug management
- PMPDP and evidence-based medicine
- Access to mental health drugs by medical assistance recipients

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Replaces the measure.

BACKGROUND: In 2001, Senate Bill 819 was enacted, which requires the creation of a Practitioner-Managed Prescription Drug Plan (PMPDP), an evidence-based program designed to give medical assistance patients access to the most effective prescription drugs appropriate for their condition while managing overall costs. The PMPDP currently has a January 2, 2014 sunset. House Bill 2090-A removes this sunset.
