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**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Requires community colleges and public universities to form achievement compact advisory committees and specifies membership and duties. Allows currently standing committees with specified membership to be designated as achievement compact advisory committees. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Variation in current practices among institutions
- Less prescriptive legislation for K-12 achievement compact advisory committees
- Collaboration and communication regarding development of achievement compacts

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** Expands applicability to include public universities. Allows currently standing committees with specified membership to be designated as achievement compact advisory committees. Removes language requiring committees to ensure implementation of achievement compacts.

**BACKGROUND:** Current law requires community colleges and universities to enter into achievement compacts with the Oregon Education Investment Board as part of the annual budgeting process. House Bill 2154-A requires community colleges and universities to form achievement compact advisory committees and specifies that the membership include the college president, full-time and part-time faculty, other employees and students. The measure directs the committee to recommend outcomes, measures of progress, goals and targets to be expressed in the achievement compact and develop plans for achieving them.
