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**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Limits patient data reported to Oregon Health Authority (OHA) by mental health and addiction services providers. Requires OHA appoint rules advisory committee; specifies membership. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** Senate Bill 238 was enacted in 2011. The bill directs the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) to conduct a line-by-line review of any rules adopted by OHA that relates to mental health and addiction treatment providers to determine if excessive requirements and redundancies can be eliminated and if the process for collecting patient data can be streamlined. Additionally, the bill authorized OHA to appoint a work group to advise the authority in the review, development, adoption and amendment of these rules and forms.

Senate Bill 379 is a continuation of the streamlining efforts being developed through OHA.
