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**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Allows Nursing Home Administrators Board, Respiratory Therapist and Polysomnographic Technologist Licensing Board, Board of Cosmetology, Board of Body Art Practitioners in Oregon Health Licensing Agency establish specific requirements for examination, licensing, and temporary licensing. Removes reference “the Educational Service Board.”

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Provides technical fixes for five boards
- Provisions of the bill

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** Currently, statutes governing the Nursing Home Administrators Board do not require an examination for individuals to be licensed; the Board is requesting flexibility to determine if an examination is necessary for individuals seeking licensure. The Respiratory Therapist and Polysomnographic Technologist Boards’ statutes allow for “education” only as a pathway to licensure; the Board is requesting to include training as a requirement in lieu of education if appropriate. The Board of Cosmetology statutes limits esthetics to full body skin care and does not define services on the face; the Board is requesting to add “face” to the scope of practice of esthetics. The Board of Body Art Practitioners’ statutes do not separate out the practice for earlobe piercing; the Board is requesting to add a new provision adding earlobe piercing as a field of practice. The Advisory Council on Hearing Aids’ statutes does not authorize temporary licensure; the Council is requesting a new provision that will allow them to issue a temporary license for qualifying individuals.
