## **Local Government Mandate:**

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

**Analysis:** This bill requires the Oregon Department of Education (ODE), the Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development (CCWD) and the Bureau of Labor and Industries (BOLI) to develop and implement long-term goals and establish joint advisory committees related to Career and Technical Education that address barriers inhibiting student movement from high schools to post-secondary school programs and the workforce. In addition, the bill requires ODE, CCWD, and BOLI to submit a report to the Legislative Assembly no later than December 1, 2013.

ODE, CCWD and BOLI anticipate needing additional resources to support the activities of the advisory committee, stakeholder outreach, and report development. ODE, CCWD and BOLI have limited General Fund resources and may need temporary workers or contractors to support the requirements of the bill.
