**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Repeals statute requiring permit to transport unlabeled onions to processing plant or more than 50 miles to livestock feeder or warehouse.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Obsolete statute

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** In 1955, legislation was passed requiring a permit to transport unlabeled onions to a processing plant or more than 50 miles to a warehouse or livestock feeder. Today, there are stringent labeling laws for packaged onions under both state and federal law. In Eastern Oregon, there is a federal marketing order in place that restricts movement of onions from certain production areas. The requirement for onion transportation permits is outdated. House Bill 2245 repeals the requirement to obtain a permit to transport unlabeled onions.
