WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Defines "school" for purposes of defining "school zone."

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

 Problem, often with leased buildings in rural areas, suffered by some Head Start and Early Intervention programs that have 55 mile per hour speed limits near facilities

**MEASURE: HB 3394** 

CARRIER: Sen. Roblan

- Transition period to/from car or bus to education facility as most dangerous for young children
- Desire to have school speed limit laws apply for safety of the children

## **EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** The term "school zone" is defined in ORS 801.462. Under that definition, a school zone is both a specific segment of highway that is adjacent to school grounds and marked by signs, and a crosswalk that is not adjacent to school grounds and marked by signs. The word "school" is not defined in ORS 801.462. House Bill 3394 adds a definition of what is meant by school to existing law.
