Measure Description:

Increases the number of members on the Construction Industry Energy Board by four, from seven to eleven members; two additional members are to be selected from the members of the State Plumbing Board and the other two additional members are to be selected from the members of the State Mechanical Board. The measure also sets aside provisions of ORS chapter 447 regulating fixture installations or regulating plumbing products, allowing the director of the Department of Consumer and Business services to adopt or reject a proposed standard recommended by the Construction Industry Energy Board that would otherwise require approval from the State Plumbing Board under those statutes. Increases the membership of the Mechanical Board from nine to ten, including the requirement that one member have experience with heat and frost insulation
