WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Allows a sheriff by agreement with the Oregon Department of Corrections (DOC) to deliver a youth offender directly to the Oregon Youth Authority (OYA). Declares emergency, effective upon passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

Keeping juveniles out of jails where they will come into contact with adult offenders

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Clarifies that any agreement to deliver a youth offender is between a sheriff and the Oregon Department of Corrections.

BACKGROUND: Currently a juvenile fifteen years of age or older, convicted of a Measure 11 offense, or a juvenile waived to adult court for trial is sentenced to the legal custody of the DOC and the physical custody of the OYA. The juvenile is processed through the DOC intake facility and eventually placed in an OYA facility.
