Measure Description:

Adds crimes to list of sex crimes requiring person convicted of sex crime or adjudicated for act that constitutes sex crime to register as sex offender after being discharged, paroled or released from correctional or detention facility.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Department of Corrections, Department of Justice, District Attorneys and their Deputies, Judicial Department, Oregon Criminal Justice Commission, Public Defense Services Commission, Oregon State Police

Analysis:

The proposed legislation has been determined to have
