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**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Reduces frequency by which Department of Education collects information related to physical education. Allows school district board to determine how to make written personnel policies available for inspection. Revises timelines for achievement compacts for school districts and education service districts. Revises open enrollment law regarding criteria for admission. Alters bus route reimbursement procedure. Restricts use of State School Fund and Local Revenue money expenditure for advertising purposes. Encourages students considering a transfer to finish current school year in school of current enrollment. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

**ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Reduction of unnecessary reporting requirements
- Current constraints of paper-based records requirements
- Confusion around existing school transfer process generally

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** Revises open enrollment law regarding criteria for admission; alters bus route reimbursement procedure; restricts use of State School Fund and Local Revenue money expenditure for advertising purposes; encourages students considering a transfer to finish current school year in school of current enrollment.

**BACKGROUND:** In 2007, the Legislative Assembly passed House Bill 3141, requiring that kindergarten through grade five students receive physical education for 150 minutes per week, and that students in grades 6-8 receive physical education for 225 minutes per week. Additionally, the legislation directs the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) to report the number of minutes Oregon students participate in physical education instruction and the availability of appropriate physical education facilities. The data collection was completed by school districts twice in the 2011-12 school year and included information from the 2010-2011 and 2011-2012 school years.

House Bill 3075-B modifies the frequency by which ODE must collect data. The measure requires ODE to collect data annually on the number of minutes physical education is provided each week to students in kindergarten through grade eight. The measure also requires ODE to collect information on the availability of appropriate physical education facilities when a public school increases or decreases its physical capacity.
