WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Requires Oregon Transparency Website include description of each state agency's percentage of expenditures made in state and outside of state under all contracts for goods or services entered into by each agency during biennium.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Intent of measure to produce itemization of origin of purchased goods or services
- Uses data currently collected; does not require new reporting by agencies
- Aggregation of existing data
- Effects of House Bill 3000 (2011)
- Concern with economic consequences of each state purchasing goods only from within its own state

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: In 2009, the Legislative Assembly enacted House Bill 2500, which required the Department of Administrative Services to create the Oregon Transparency Website with information about state agency revenues, expenditures, contracting, human resources and other data. Additional measures in the 2011 session expanded the data included on the Transparency Website. Currently, the Transparency Website includes reports on contracts established by the Department of Administrative Services, the Oregon Lottery, the Department of Transportation, educational service districts, and the Oregon University System.

House Bill 3400-A requires the Transparency Website include a description of the percentage of expenditures made instate and out-of-state for each agency's contracts for goods and services.
