Measure Description:

Requires notice of sale of home to include statement that some residential property sold at trustee’s sale may have been used in manufacturing methamphetamines, chemical components of which are known to be toxic.

Government Unit(s) Affected:

Counties, Department of Consumer and Business Services (DCBS), Department of Human Services (DHS), Department of Justice, Department of Revenue(DOR), Department of Veterans' Affairs, Housing and Community Services Department

Analysis:

The proposed legislation has been determined to have
