WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Requires persons convicted of crimes in a court of the United States that required sex offender registration to register in Oregon, even if the crime they were convicted of does not require registration in Oregon. Pertains to federal convictions. Makes clear that even if the crime in a different jurisdiction would not have been a sex crime in Oregon, the person will carry the registration requirements from the state of origin. Applies only to crimes committed after the passage of this act.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

• Oregon should make sure it's laws do not inadvertently incentivize sex offenders to relocate here in order to avoid the registration requirements of the original jurisdiction of conviction.

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Makes clear that even if the crime in a different jurisdiction would not have been a sex crime in Oregon, the person will carry the registration requirements from the state of origin.

BACKGROUND: House Bill 3253B would ensure that Oregon does not inadvertently incentivize sex offenders moving into the jurisdiction of Oregon in order to avoid the sex registration requirements that they were sentenced under in a different jurisdiction.
