WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Requires Department of Human Services to exercise due diligence to locate grandparents of a child who is before a court in a dependency matter where there is an allegation of abuse and neglect and the court is considering placing the child outside the home. Gives grandparents a right to be heard in a dependency matter involving a grandchild. Allows a grandparent visitation rights with a grandchild in dependency matter except in a termination of parental rights proceeding. Applies to proceedings commenced on or after the effective date of this Act.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Specific types of situations addressed by the bill
- Recognition of how email or other "non-visitation" contact can help support relationship between child and grandparent

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: In Oregon, 28,000 grandparents have custody of their grandchildren. Currently, the Department of Human Services will give notice to a grandparent of a dependency proceeding involving a grandchild if the grandparent requests notice but not seek them out. Research shows that children placed with grandparents or other family members do better than when placed with strangers.
