**BACKGROUND:** Considered to be a living part of West Linn's centennial history, Alice Richmond has lived in West Linn for 55 years. Ms. Richmond has been integral to the community, well-known for her forward-thinking leadership and problem solving.

Born in Lyons, France, on May 26, 1930, Alice Richmond moved to New York City in 1949 to open her own store on Madison Avenue and to work as a clothing designer for apparel company, Seventh Avenue. After marrying Robert Richmond, she brought her family west where, for the last 55 years, she has been a leader in the West Linn community and politically active in city issues, including working on initiatives for parks, water infrastructure and schools. Ms. Richmond ran for mayor in 2008 and served on the political action committee board to build a new police building for the West Linn Police Department.

Ms. Richmond has been central to the launch of many of West Linn's most popular community events, including the Central Village Summer Days and the Oktoberfest. She helped produce the Summer Fun Music Concerts and the annual Fourth of July fireworks in historic Willamette Park, and created the 9/11 Yellow Ribbon Project to honor those who lost their lives on September 11, 2001.
