**Measure Description:**

Abolishes Oregon Educator Professional Development Commission.

**Local Government Mandate:**

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

**Analysis:** SB 271 would abolish the Oregon Educator Professional Development Commission (OEPDC) and transfer the program to the Department of Education (ODE). In addition, ODE will maintain a website for posting professional development (PD) opportunities, assist school districts in developing PD plans, develop and share state standards for PD, coordinate and align the delivery of PD across the state, and provide recommend evaluative tools to determine the effectiveness of PD. OEPDC was established by the Legislature in 2009 and provided with \$130,000 for the first year's operation. Additional funding was not provided by the Legislature in subsequent years.

The fiscal impact is included as part of the \$33 million in funding for the Network for Quality Teaching and Learning established in HB 3233. This funding is included in the Oregon Department of Education's budget for 2013-15.
