Measure Description:

Removes requirement that grant to purchase Oregon food products and to fund certain educational activities be allocated in specified percentage.

Local Government Mandate:

This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

Analysis: This bill directs the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) to distribute grant money and changes that 80 percent of the moneys distributed are used for reimbursements and that 10 percent of the money distributed are used for education activities. It further clarifies that the school districts shall use the moneys, instead of being reimbursed, for costs incurred by the school district to purchase Oregon food products. Authorizes ODE to award grant to school district only if district can demonstrate it has or is developing program to both purchase Oregon food products and provide related educational activities. The bill also removes requirement that at least two grants be awarded each biennium under program. In addition the bill appropriates \$500,000 General Fund to grant program for biennium beginning July 1, 2013.
