WHAT THE BILL DOES: Continues the Small School District Grants for two more fiscal years. Repeals the law governing the Grants on June 30, 2015. Specifies that transportation for a student enrolled in an eligible day treatment program be provided by a school district where the student is a resident. Takes effect on passage.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Funds and grants available for small schools
- Foreign exchange students as resident students in some school districts

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENTS: Continues the Small School District Grants for two more fiscal years. Specifies that transportation for a student enrolled in an eligible day treatment program be provided by a school district where the student is a resident.

BACKGROUND: Small school districts with small high schools defined in the ORS 327.355 receive their respective prorated shares of the Small School District Grants of \$2.5 million per school year. The law regarding the grants was repealed on June 30, 2013.
