WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Expands membership of Oregon Liquor Control Commission's Alcohol Server Education Advisory Committee to include two educators and two representatives of alcohol server education providers.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Value of adding educators to the advisory committee
- Ability of advisory committee to request input of educators

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: The Alcohol Server Education Advisory Committee was established in 1985. The mission of the committee is to advise the Oregon Liquor Control Commission (OLCC) in the development, evaluation, and enhancement of the Alcohol Server Education Program standards, curriculum and materials. The OLCC administers the committee and appoints members. Members of the committee represent various stakeholders in the industry including the Oregon Liquor Control Commission, the Oregon State Police, the Oregon District Attorneys Association, the Oregon Health Authority, the Department of Transportation, at least one person who holds a service permit, a nonprofit organization the purpose of which is to reduce the incidence of drunk driving, and not more than three associations representing retail licensees and two associations representing insurance companies. HB 2057 expands membership of the committee to include two educators and two representatives of alcohol server education providers.
