House Bill 2145

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes task force to make recommendations for prohibiting or limiting state actions or suits against nonnegligent landowners for state forestland damage resulting from fire spreading from other forestland.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to liability for forestland fires; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

- 4 SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Forestland Fire Liability is established, consisting of
- 5 13 members appointed as follows:
- 6 (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint:
- 7 (A) One member from among members of the Senate.
- 8 (B) Two members who are knowledgeable regarding forest practices, firefighting or li-
- 9 ability issues.

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- 10 (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint:
- 11 (A) One member from among members of the House of Representatives.
- 12 (B) Two members who are knowledgeable regarding forest practices, firefighting or li-13 ability issues.
- (c) The Governor shall appoint four members who are knowledgeable regarding forest
 practices, firefighting or liability issues.
- (d) The Director of the Department of State Lands shall appoint one representative from
 the Department of State Lands.
- (e) The State Forester shall appoint one representative from the State Forestry Depart ment.
- 20 (f) The Attorney General shall appoint one representative from the Department of Jus-21 tice.

(2) The task force shall develop recommendations for prohibiting or limiting state actions
 or suits against nonnegligent landowners for damage to state forestlands that results from
 the spreading of fire from other forestlands.

- (3) The task force may study, research, hold public hearings and take other actions reasonable for facilitating the development of recommendations described in subsection (2) of
 this section.
- (4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction
 of business.
- 30 (5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members

1 of the task force.

2 (6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.

3 (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint 4 ment to become immediately effective.

5 (8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson 6 or of a majority of the voting members of the task force.

(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.

8 (10) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and 9 may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative 10 Assembly related to natural resources no later than October 1, 2014.

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(11) The State Forestry Department shall provide staff support to the task force.

(12) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing functions of the task force shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the State Forestry Department for purposes of the task force.

(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

22 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the 2015 23 regular session of the Legislative Assembly as specified in ORS 171.010.

24 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 25 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect 26 on its passage.

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
