House Bill 2147

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires State Fish and Wildlife Director to appoint Wildlife Damage Control Advisory Council. Specifies duties of council.

Sunsets January 2, 2016.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to wildlife damage control.

Whereas crop losses and livestock deaths due to wildlife damage cost farmers and ranchers in this state millions of dollars each year; and

Whereas additional millions of dollars in costs accrue to farmers and ranchers in this state from wildlife damage to structures, veterinarian costs to treat injured livestock and preventative measures to deter wildlife; and

Whereas farmers, ranchers and other landowners in this state voluntarily provide significant habitat for wildlife in this state, and the appropriate management of wildlife populations is imperative so as to not create undue economic hardship to farmers, ranchers and other landowners in this state; now, therefore,

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) The State Fish and Wildlife Director, after consultation with the Director of Agriculture, shall appoint a Wildlife Damage Control Advisory Council. Persons appointed to the council serve at the pleasure of the State Fish and Wildlife Director. The council shall meet semiannually to:

- (a) Review information and make recommendations to agencies, as defined in ORS 183.310, regarding the development and coordination of programs and activities related to wildlife damage control.
 - (b) Assist farmers, ranchers and other landowners in wildlife damage control.
 - (2) The last semiannual meeting of the council shall be held prior to June 1, 2015.
- (3) Members of the council are not entitled to compensation or expenses under ORS 292.495.
- (4) The State Fish and Wildlife Director shall report regarding the activities of the Wildlife Damage Control Advisory Council to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to environment and natural resources on or before October 31, 2014.
 - SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2013 Act is repealed on January 2, 2016.
