## **A-Engrossed** House Bill 2187

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Establishes requirements to transition school between career school regulated by Department of

Education and career school regulated by agency of executive department. Allows Superintendent of Public Instruction to grant exemption to authorize agency to regulate certain career schools.] Exempts school from career school licensure requirements if school prepares students to become nursing assistant or medication aide and meets certain standards or if school is adequately regulated by other means and Superintendent of Public Instruction grants exemption.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2013.

8 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2013 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 9 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2013 Act takes effect 10 July 1, 2013.

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
