House Bill 2313

Sponsored by Representative READ (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires insurer to provide process for nurse practitioner practicing in rural or frontier area to earn same reimbursement paid to primary care physician.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to reimbursement of nurse practitioner services; amending ORS 743A.036.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 743A.036 is amended to read:

743A.036. (1) Whenever any policy of health insurance provides for reimbursement for any service which is within the lawful scope of practice of a duly licensed and certified nurse practitioner, including prescribing or dispensing drugs, the insured under the policy is entitled to reimbursement for such service whether it is performed by a physician licensed by the Oregon Medical Board or by a duly licensed nurse practitioner.

- (2) An insurer shall provide a process through which a nurse practitioner may obtain the same reimbursement for a service that the insurer pays to a primary care physician for the service if:
- (a) The nurse practitioner maintains an independent primary care practice in a rural or frontier area, as designated by the Office of Rural Health; and
- (b) No licensed primary care physician is practicing in a location that is less than 15 miles from the location of the practice of the nurse practitioner.
- [(2)] (3) This section does not apply to group practice health maintenance organizations that are federally qualified pursuant to Title XIII of the Health Maintenance Organization Act or to nurse practitioners employed by or in a professional services contract with a licensed health care facility, ambulatory surgical center or physician's office.

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
