House Bill 2320

Sponsored by Representative BUCKLEY (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Allows city to seek designation of enterprise zone for electronic commerce regardless of whether zone is existing enterprise zone.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to enterprise zones for electronic commerce; amending ORS 285C.095; and prescribing an
 effective date.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 285C.095 is amended to read:

6 285C.095. (1)(a) A sponsor of an existing enterprise zone may seek to have the zone designated 7 for electronic commerce under this [section] subsection.

8 [(2)] (b) The sponsor [shall] must file an application to have the zone designated for electronic 9 commerce with the Oregon Business Development Department. The application [shall] must be in 10 the form and contain the information that the department by rule may require.

11 [(3)] (c) The application [*shall*] **must** be accompanied by a copy of a resolution, adopted by the 12 governing body of the sponsor, requesting that the zone be designated for electronic commerce.

[(4)] (d) The department shall review applications for electronic commerce designation under
 this subsection and shall approve no more than 10 zones for electronic commerce designation.

(2)(a) Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section, a city may seek to have an enterprise zone for electronic commerce designated under this subsection regardless of whether the zone is an existing enterprise zone.

(b) The city must file an application to have the zone designated for electronic commerce
 with the Oregon Business Development Department. The application must be in the form and
 contain the information that the department by rule may require.

(c) The application must be accompanied by a copy of a resolution adopted by the governing body of the city requesting that the enterprise zone for electronic commerce be designated and a plan to develop an electronic commerce industry in the zone.

(d) The department shall review applications for designation of enterprise zones for
electronic commerce under this subsection. There is no limit on the number of zones that
may be designated.

[(5)] (3) [The] A sponsor may by resolution revoke an electronic commerce designation made under this section. If an election is revoked, the sponsor may not subsequently seek reinstatement of electronic commerce designation.

30 <u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2013 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2013 31 regular session of the Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.
